How do birds handle wildfires? Birds reveal flexible comeback strategies to wildfire, contingent on burn severity and considering their ontological survival approach. Most often, beetle-foraging and cavity-nesting birds profit from high-severity fires that generate snags. In comparison, birds configured for insect foraging in foliage are likely to ramp down after a wildfire. The adverse impacts of wildfires on numerous bird populations seem to be temporally limited to the year of the burn. While researchers discovered that populations bounced back to preburn levels following the burn year; populations in a few cases substantially decreased the subsequent year. We will examine how snags of all sizes function as critical habitat factors for cavitynesting birds among other wildlife that exploit tree cavities. Grasp how the "fire birds" survive a conflagration.


